

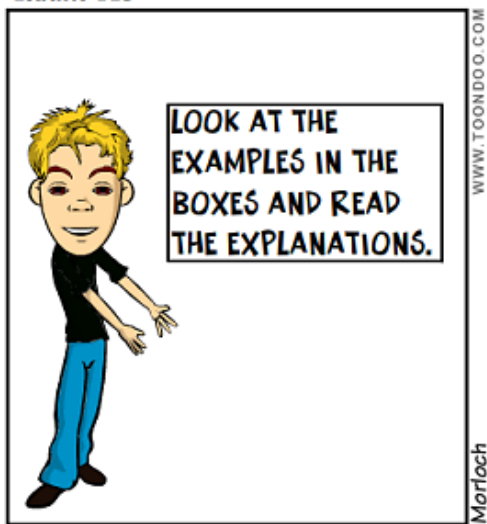

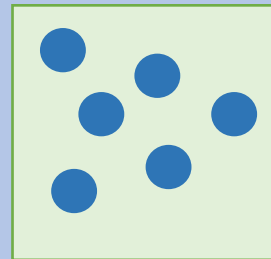

EXAMPLES



EVERY



Every ball in this box is blue.

⇒ They are all blue.

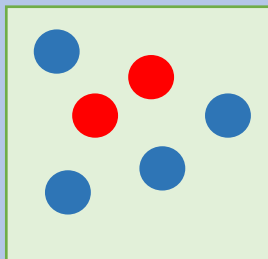
Every means **all**. You can use it in positive statements, in negative statements and in questions.

Examples:

I won **every** match. (I didn't lose a single one.)-

Did you win **every** match? - I didn't win **every** match. (I lost one or more.)

SOME



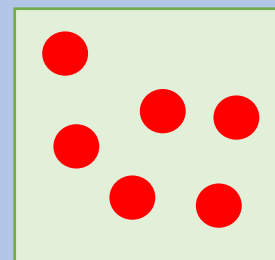
Some of the balls in this box are blue.

⇒ There are blue balls in the box. But there are also red ones in the box.

Some means more than one, but not all.

Example: I won **some** matches. (I won more than one, but didn't win all matches.)

NO / ANY



No ball in this box is blue.

⇒ There is not one blue ball in this box. All the balls are not blue.

(You could also say: There aren't **any** blue balls in the box.)

Example: I've got **no** car. = I don't have **any** car.

I won **no** match in the tournament. = I didn't win **any** match in the tournament.
