## compounds with some, any, every, and no



Compounds are words which are a combination of two or more words, for example basketball, skateboard, school uniform, or classroom. You can also make compounds with some, any, no, and every. Combine them with 'one', 'body', 'where', and 'thing' to make new words. Take a look at the table below to find out more about it.

some	someone/somebody	somewhere	something
any	anyone/anybody	anywhere	anything
every	everybody/everyone	everywhere	everything
no	nobody/no one	nowhere	nothing
